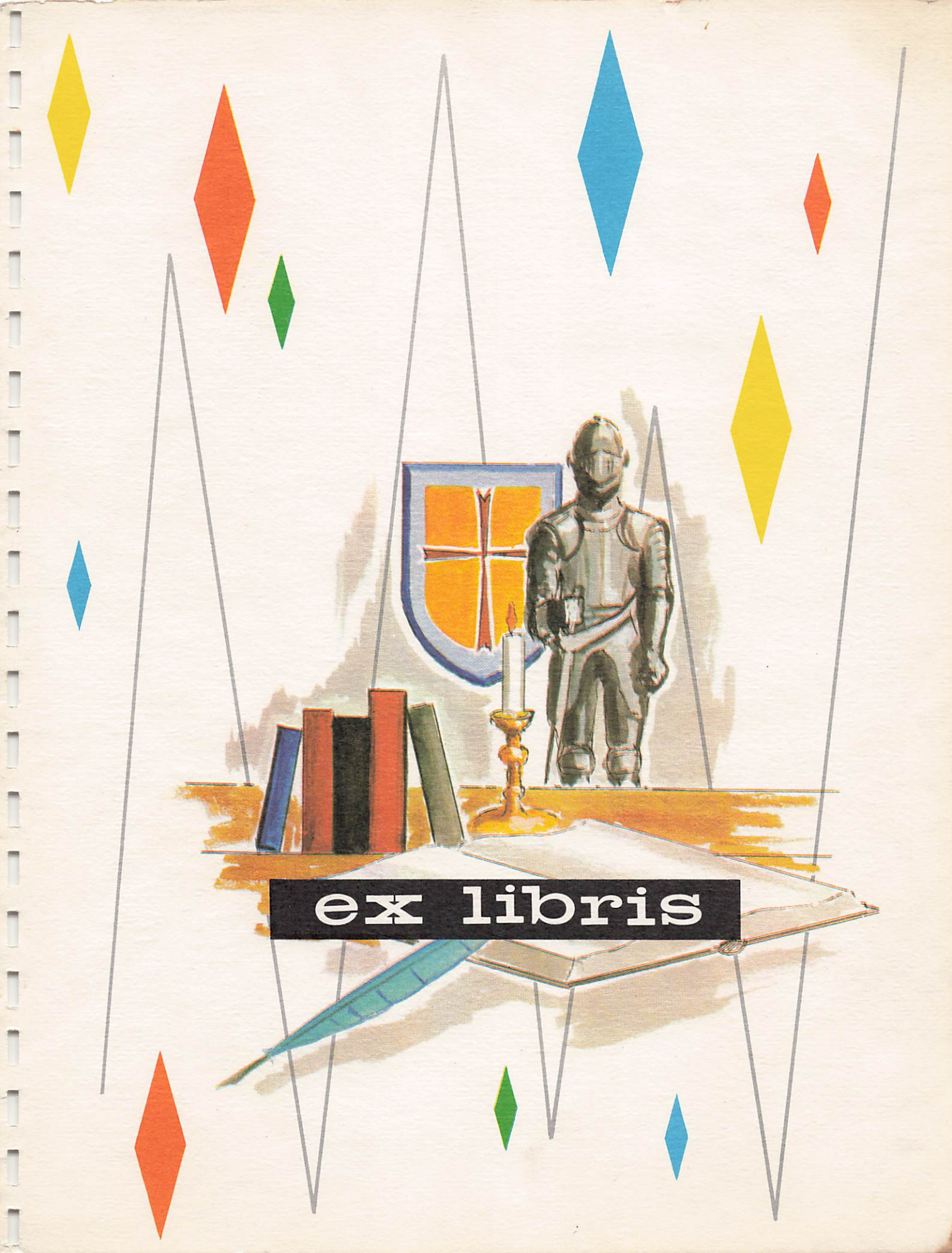

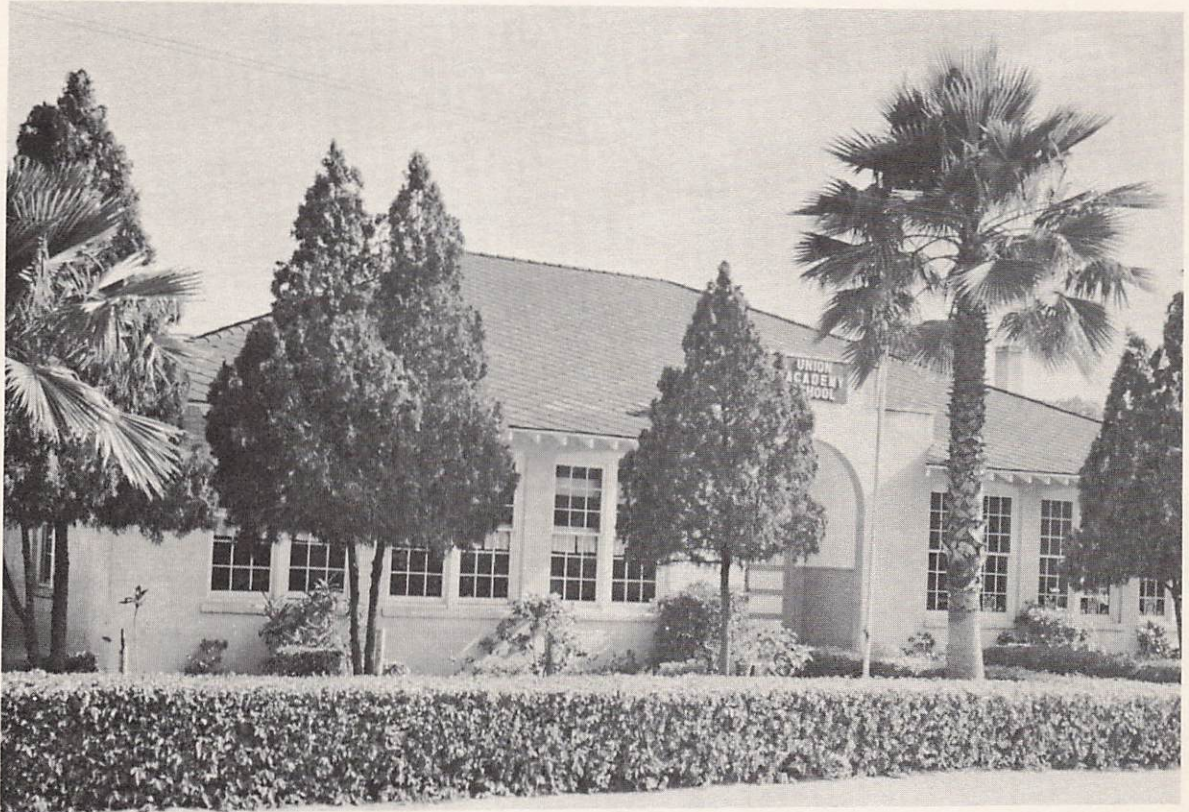

Union, to thee, we praise.

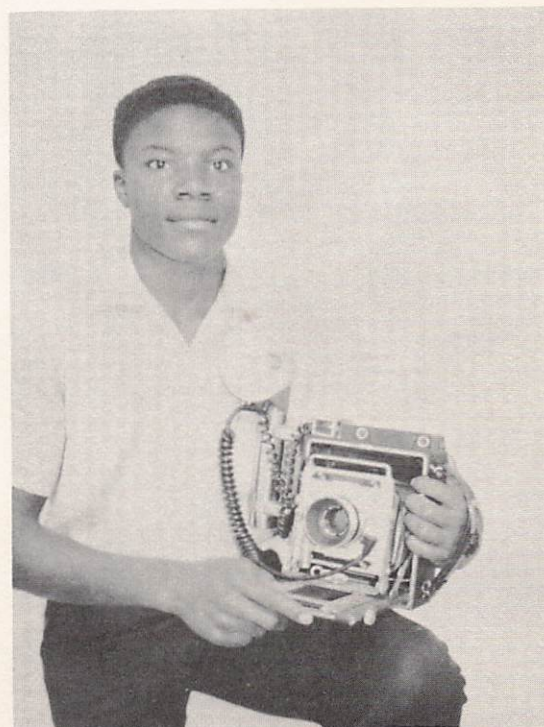

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

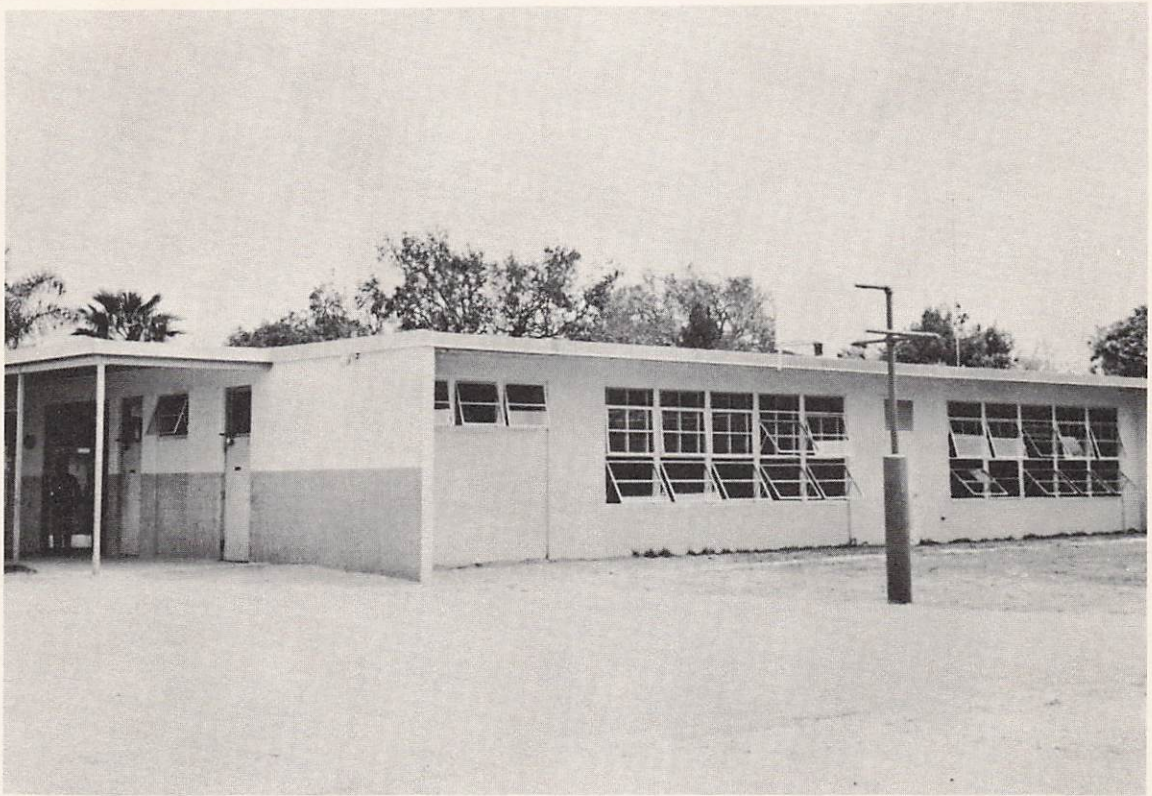
